It has certainly been an unusual week in school!

I would like to thank all those who offered help, support and kind words when we discovered the burst pipe in school on Monday morning. The burst pipe caused significant and sustained flooding across the Reception classroom, the Year One and Two classroom, the corridor, the staff toilet and the office. Unfortunately, the flooding has caused significant damage to the Reception classroom and we anticipate the children will be out of their classroom and using the hall for some time to come. There is also damage to other areas across school and whilst currently useable they will need some remedial works going forward. We will keep you updated as to when any works will be happening. Thank you, in particular, for your patience on Monday if you were trying to contact the school – we had to work hard to keep the office viable so it may have taken us a while to get back to you.

Key Stage 2 Lunch

You will have received an email earlier in the week asking Key Stage 2 children to continue bringing packed lunches throughout next week – thank you for your patience with this. We have tried very hard to find relief staff to work in the kitchen but unfortunately the agencies we usually deal with are experiencing staff shortages of their own.

COVID -19

We have been advised that there has been at least one confirmed case of COVID-19 within the school. We know that you may find this concerning but we are continuing to monitor the situation and ensure the required controls are in place. Following the change in guidance on 19 July 2021, the school will continue to ensure confirmed cases of COVID-19 do not attend until the end of their self-isolation period but contact tracing within the school setting will no longer continue. You may be contacted by NHS Test and Trace and asked to get a PCR test if your child has been identified as a close contact.


The school remains open and your child should continue to attend as normal if they remain well.
