Last week, Ukraine was invaded by Russia. This has no doubt led to many conversations at home, as children try to understand what it means and why it happened. School has received guidance from the DFE about supporting conversations in school and answering pupils' questions. Although this is happening in another country, we should not underestimate how a child processes what they see and hear and the scenarios that they believe could happen. It is important that our children understand the world in which we live and of course, how they can make a difference, but we should also continue to reassure them that they are safe at home and at school and that they should let a trusted adult know if they are worried. It also showcases some of the positive actions and people that have come out of this terrible event, to show children there are more good people than bad in the world. They are giving all parents FREE access to this Friday's full First News edition (attached).

The **Disasters Emergency Committee** which has launched a <u>Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal</u>. You will be aware that the DEC brings together a number of leading aid charities including Christian Aid, Oxfam and Save the Children in order to raise funds quickly when large-scale disasters hit countries without the capacity to respond. It is quick and easy to donate and the UK Government will match pound-for-pound up to £20 million donated by the public to this appeal. DEC charities and their local partners are in Ukraine and in neighbouring countries providing water, food, shelter and medical assistance.
