Heat Wave

As I'm sure you already know we are forecast extremely high temperatures at the beginning of next week. To keep everybody safe and to help keep everybody comfortable we ask that the following should be undertaken:

- children do not have to wear school uniform on Monday and Tuesday of next week: they can be suitably dressed in loose-fitting, cool, appropriate clothing for the heat, this should include a hat
- · children must have sun cream on
- children must come to school with a water bottle: these will kept on desks where appropriate and children will be reminded to drink regularly

We will cancel any PE lessons at the beginning of the week and our staff will assess whether we feel it is safe to go outside. If we do, children will be discouraged from active play and will remain in the shade. This is all in in line with advice from the DfE document: Looking After Children in a Heatwave. We understand that some parents and carers are particularly concerned about the extreme weather at the beginning of next week and may wish to keep their children at home, please let us know if this is the case.
