They have explored chromatography to see what colours are in a black pen, filtered light to write secret messages, forces to make balloon rockets, growing their own salt crystals and exploding volcanic eruptions in fizzy drink bottles. Each session we used the term 'I wonder' to explore the Science concept even further. Great fun has been had by all!
