- To create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas
- To improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials (e.g. pencil, charcoal, paint, clay, textiles)

Art Skills

- Demonstrate their understanding of great designers in history and explain key features of each era of fashion
- Use a sketch book to explore ideas and test materials and techniques, adapt their own work and improve original ideas

Sequence

- History of Fashion
- Fashion in today's society - fast fashion. Positives and Negatives of Fast Fashion.
- How companies/individuals can change or improve this situation - e.g. Fairtrade/Sustainability/ Reuse/Recycle/Reduce/ Repair
- Textile Art techniques - leading on to making a re-useable bag
