British Science Week 2024

Take a look at what each of the classes have been up to with a focus around the concept 'time'.

TIGERS:

In British Science Week this week we have looked at two things in Tigers related to our Forces topic. First, the forces on a F1 Ferrari car, especially thrust, drag, air resistance and friction. Children have labelled car diagrams and completed challenges around these concepts. We also discovered how to make the world's best paper airplane. Mr Trudgill showed the children a video of the Japanese airplane-maker who created a paper plane which stayed in the air for around 28 seconds. Children first had a go at making this plane using a YouTube video. Then they have been given several links to a range of websites with paper airplane designs and instructions to try out themselves. **The challenge:** to create a paper plane which stays in the air for the longest possible time. Children have been testing their planes. So far the most successful plane (made by Gaby) has stayed up for 2.5 seconds!

BUSY BEES:

In Busy Bees we started the week with a Scientific Day. We started with some Physics where we learnt about clocks and how clocks had changed over time through the Live Science Week lesson. We then did some Chemistry, where we found out about all the properties of plastic, the great everyday uses of plastic and some of the issues with single use plastic. We ordered a timeline of how plastics have developed over the past 150 years and found out that the first type of plastic was invented in 1862. Then the children had a go at making their own biodegradable plastic. After this, we joined in with the BBC Science Week lesson and looked at how invertebrates change over time in their lifecycles. We learnt the difference between complete and incomplete metamorphosis. Finally, we finished our day with a visit from one of our Scientific parents, Mrs Morley. She came into to tell the children about her job at the Water Treatment Works and explained the process of the water cycle and how the water treatment and sewage treatment works. The children got to make their own mini water cycles in a bag and tested the water at different stages of the treatment plan using a PH monitor. A massive thank you to Mrs Morley for organising this. A great day had by all!

PEARS:

In Pears this week we have conducted our own experiment exploring the theme of 'time'. We decided to find out which bowl would be best to make jelly in. We needed the jelly to set as quickly as possible. We worked in groups to follow the instructions to make the jelly and carefully stored them in the fridge. We made our own predictions of which bowl would be best and had a brilliant class discussion. We kept a close eye on them and found the jelly in the smallest bowl set the quickest.

APPLES:

We have looked at the life cycle of a frog, explored volcanoes and made our own and then watched it erupt with vinegar and baking powder (they hated the smell), looked at items that sink and float and the materials that they were and lastly we did a balloon experiment where a balloon travelled across the string as the air came out, the bigger the ballon the further it went.

WHOLE SCHOOL:

We also ran a competition called 'The Greatest Electrical Invention of all Time' and it was lovely to receive a wide range of entries from across the school. Winners will be announced on Monday in our Science Share Worship. We will also look at the results of our Big Plastic Count—please don't forget to input your data on Sunday.
