British Science Week

British Science Week this year runs from Friday 8th March to Sunday 17th March. The theme this year is 'Time'. As always, we enjoy taking part in lots of Science Activities through the week to inspire and motivate children to learn about Science. Over the course of the week, all the children in school will take part in a Science Activity linked to this theme in their classrooms.

As part of the week, we shall be looking at how plastic pollution has affected the planet over time. Each class will take part in the Big Plastic Count both in school and at home. This has been introduced to your children in school and a letter and Tally Count sheet has been sent home. If you have lost it or wish to access the link directly, this is also on tapestry. It explains how to count the plastic you throw away each day during next week from Monday to Sunday and how to input the data at home online through the unique class link. If for whatever reason you can't input the data at home, please send your form in with your child the following Monday for your child to input at school instead. From this we will be able to generate our Class and School Plastic footprint!

We will also be running our yearly Science poster competition for all classes to enter. This year the theme is 'The Greatest Electrical Invention of all time'. This has already been introduced on tapestry and to your children in class and hopefully they have come home to tell you all about it. If your child would like to participate, they need to produce an informative poster about which electrical invention they believe to be the greatest of all time. Please can they complete this at home and return to school for Monday 11th March FAO Miss Ellis. There will be an exciting electrical themed prize for both the younger children in Apples and Pears, and the older children in Busy Bees and Tigers.
