Your child may wish to eat a full breakfast at home first and use this as a little energy top up, which is no problem at all.



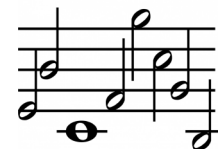

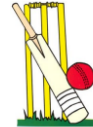
