Reader of the Week and Golden Writer Awards


Congratulations to Ike (Y3) who has been awarded our Golden Writer Award for showing such progress in both the content and presentation of his writing. Well done!

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Tewit Youth Band is the Youth Brass Band for the Harrogate & District area and we're members have the opportunity to meet, play on the look out for new players between the music and socialise with other young people ages of 7 and 18.
