Why not write your own diary (either real or imaginary)?</p> <p>You could pretend to be someone different and write it from their point of view e.g. your pet!</p>	<p>Encourage your child to read regularly at home. Support them with their reading by asking questions about what they have read. Remember we have Book Swap Box in the classroom if they want to swap any books from home.</p> <p><b>If you complete your reading chart, collect a reward from Miss Ellis. If you enjoy your book, please ask to share it with your class.</b></p>
<p><b>Project:</b></p> <p>This term we are learning about the Ancient Egyptians. Do a mini-project on one aspect of Ancient Egyptians that you wish to explore further. Find examples and take photographs of examples of Evaporation and Condensation.</p>	<p><b>Project:</b></p> <p>This half term we are learning about rivers. In particular, we are focussing on the River Nile. You could choose to explore other rivers e.g. local rivers in your area (maybe even visit one!) or famous rivers in the world.
