Classroom Changes

As you will already be aware, we are very excited about the up and coming building works which will take place over the summer holiday, including building our new outdoor Discovery Classroom and erecting our new trim trails and quiet area on the playground.

As part of our evaluation of the provision we have for each year group, we have made the decision to move some classrooms around slightly in order to better utilise the outdoor areas.

As such, the existing classrooms for Y1/2 and Y3/4 will swap, meaning the new Pears classroom will be where Busy Bees are currently and the new Busy Bees classroom will be where Pears are based at present.

Miss M Ellis will utilise the outdoor space for KS1 focussed continuous provision. The gardening area will be allocated a new space on school grounds so that this can still be accessed by all children.

Please note that transition morning will be based in the current classrooms as we won't have moved all the appropriate provision by this point.

School Lunches: Price Increase

Over the years we have tried to avoid the need to regularly increase the cost of school lunches despite numerous increases in costs. The delivery of school meals is subsidised by schools and with further increases to the National Living Wage and National Insurance Contributions, along with the cost of supplies continuing to rise, we have had to make the decision to increase the cost of lunches from September 2025. The cost of a school lunch will rise to £2.85 per day (£14.25 per week). Whilst this increase does not cover the subsidy for school, it will keep it from rising to a point that will impact other areas of the school budget.

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will still benefit from the governments universal free school meal. Although this is not means-tested, if you do qualify for any financial support shown below, we would encourage you to complete our online form as this could enable your child's school to claim the Pupil Premium Funding to further support them.

The Government also offer all children the opportunity to benefit from a free school meal if parents are in receipt of any of the following benefits:

• Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit

• Child Tax Credit, provided you are also not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual household gross income that does not exceed £16,190

• Working Tax Credit run-on, paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

If your child is eligible for and receiving free school meals currently, this will continue.
