<p>FLOURISH:</p> <p>Teachers use creativity and innovation to inspire pupils</p> <p>Teachers ask big questions even if they don't know the answers</p> <p>Teachers lead collective worship, which gives opportunities for learning, reflecting and responding</p> <p>Leaders ensure that worship celebrates difference and encourages respect</p> <p>Collective worship is planned to allow pupils to make connections</p>	<p>COLLECTIVE WORSHIP SHOULD BE:</p> <p>INVITATIONAL</p> <p>INCLUSIVE</p> <p>INSPIRING</p> <p>SPIRITUAL</p> <p>All members of the school community explain how collective worship influences their lives, both in and out of school</p>	<p>FLOURISH:</p> <p>Pupils grow spiritually through experiences of prayer, stillness, worship and reflection</p> <p>Pupils listen, question, explore and challenge</p> <p>Pupils identify injustice and inequality and are inspired into action</p> <p>Pupils talk about forgiveness and reconciliation</p> <p>Pupils reflect on their behaviour, values and attitudes through worship</p> <p>Pupils identify themselves as leaders in collective worship, planning, delivering and evaluating</p> <p>Pupils can articulate the importance of collective worship for school and home life and what it means to them personally</p>
<p>BLOSSOM:</p> <p>Planning collective worship which gives the pupils an opportunity to encounter the teachings of Jesus and to relate these to school values</p> <p>Opportunities are given for different types of prayer and reflection (it is not compulsory or forced)</p> <p>The local church community is regularly involved in collective worship e.g. Open the Book/ Eucharist led by Rector</p> <p>Other Christian denominations invited to deliver worship</p>	<p>THE LITURGY</p> <p>Our Collective Worship follows a liturgical structure</p> <p>Collective Worship is grounded in distinctively Christian Teaching</p>	<p>BLOSSOM:</p> <p>Pupils are actively engaged in collective worship</p> <p>Pupils experience different forms of Christian worship</p> <p>Pupils listen to the teachings of Jesus and hear readings from the bible</p> <p>Pupils are given time for response through: stillness, silence, prayer and reflection</p> <p>Pupils visit different places of worship</p>

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<p>GROW:</p> <p>Create an environment which reflects the value we place on collective worship</p> <p>Create seating which encourages pupils to reflect, respond and share</p> <p>Select appropriate lighting, sounds and smells</p> <p>Use symbols including those reflecting the liturgical calendar</p>	<p>ENVIRONMENT</p> <p>Provide a time and environment for worship in which all pupils including those of other faiths and none can be present with integrity</p>	<p>GROW:</p> <p>Collective Worship ambassadors set the worship table e.g. bible open at today's verses, worship cloth colours corresponding to the Church season/ Music playing</p> <p>Older pupils signal the call to worship by ringing a bell and lead the younger pupils into the hall</p> <p>Older pupils support younger pupils</p> <p>Seating of pupils encourages a sense of belonging</p> <p>The singing bowl is followed by a liturgical greeting</p>
